This issue was struck at Massalia in Gaul, where Flaccus was serving as proconsul by special decree of the Senate. The military reverse is probably associated with the campaigns of Sulla against Q. Sertorius in Spain.

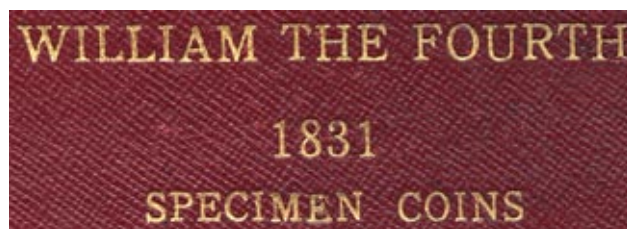

It would make sense to theorise that the production of this piece was used to cement the reputations of the Roettier family, and secure their lofty positions at the Mint after the Restoration of King Charles II. The King already favoured the Roettiers from his time in exile in the Low Countries, and Thomas Simon, the former Chief Engraver under the Puritans, knew his position in the Mint was starting to deteriorate when John Roettier was made joint chief engraver on the 19th of May, 1662.

The Roettiers had produced the highly regarded first bust style Crowns of Charles II, initially, in 1662 as a proof, and a currency issue was produced for 1662 and 1663. They were also struck in the smallest of numbers in gold, with both lettered and plain edges, (please enquire for an example of the 1662 plain edge gold piece currently new in stock for sale at £85,000).

Thomas Simon produced his famed Reddite Crown; dated 1663, to show how skilled he was at engraving the King's effigy and hoped it would be used instead of the Roettier design. However this did not impress upon the King's counsel, and Simon made a further pattern of his Crown with the famous two line "Petition" to the King around the edge of the coin asking the King to compare his to the Dutch. Perhaps feeling threatened by the obvious skill of Simon, it would make sense to theorise from the chronology that the production of this second bust so soon after the first, was deemed necessary to assert the Roettiers position at the Mint. The second bust type was first produced in 1664 as this proof, and continues through each year until 1671. The second bust type was therefore more successful and long-lived in production than the first bust.

These 1664 Proof Crowns therefore resulted in the position of the Roettiers being affirmed for all to see, and Thomas Simon was demoted to working on the small silver coins, medals and seals only, and later died in 1665, purportedly from the Plague. Therefore if our theory is correct the significance of the 1664 Proof Crown cannot be underestimated with the intricately fine engraving of the portrait of the King demonstrating the skill of the Dutch engravers.

The only other piece we can trace in commerce of the Proof 1664 Crown was the inferior condition one sold in St James Auction No.2 which had a wonderful provenance dating back to the 18th Century through many collections. The piece offered for sale here as far as we can assert has been held in a collection on the Continent off the market for many years.

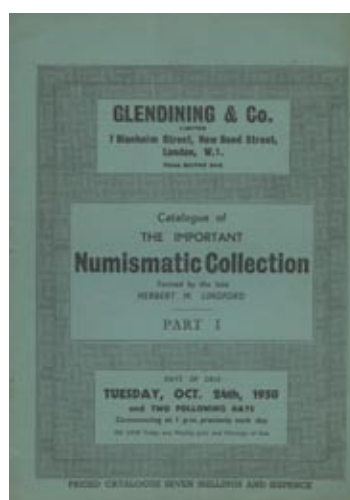

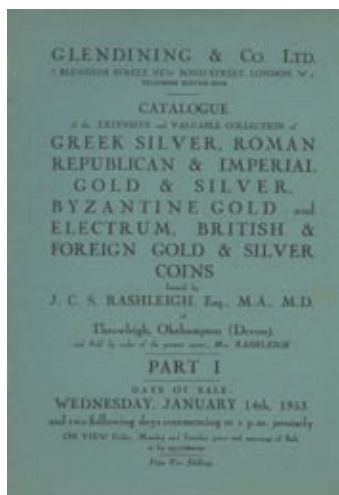

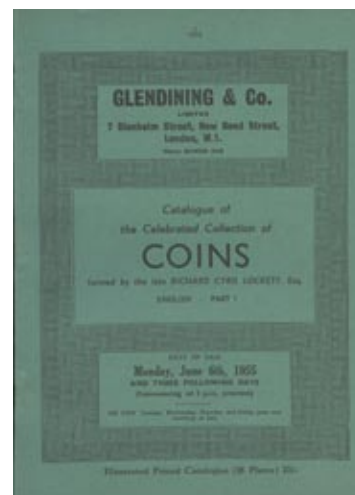

The hoard was uncovered in Brussels in July 1908 by workmen engaged in pulling down an old tavern almost in the shadow of the Cathedral of St Gudule and St Michael.

It seems that the hoard was roughly divided into two halves - one part of about 81,000 coins consisted predominantly of English, Irish and Scottish coins plus many imitations and a few hundred obols; the other of about 64,000 continental coins, the largest portion being those of the dukes of Brabant. Most of the second group (roughly 55,000) were melted down after an initial identification. It was, however, through the foresight of Charles Dupriez that the "English" portion of the hoard was kept intact for detailed study. These coins were sold en-bloc at an auction in Brussels in October 1909. The purchase of the coins by Albert Baldwin has now the aura of a fable - it has been said that some potential buyers were delayed by fog, leaving the field almost exclusively to the founder of Baldwins.

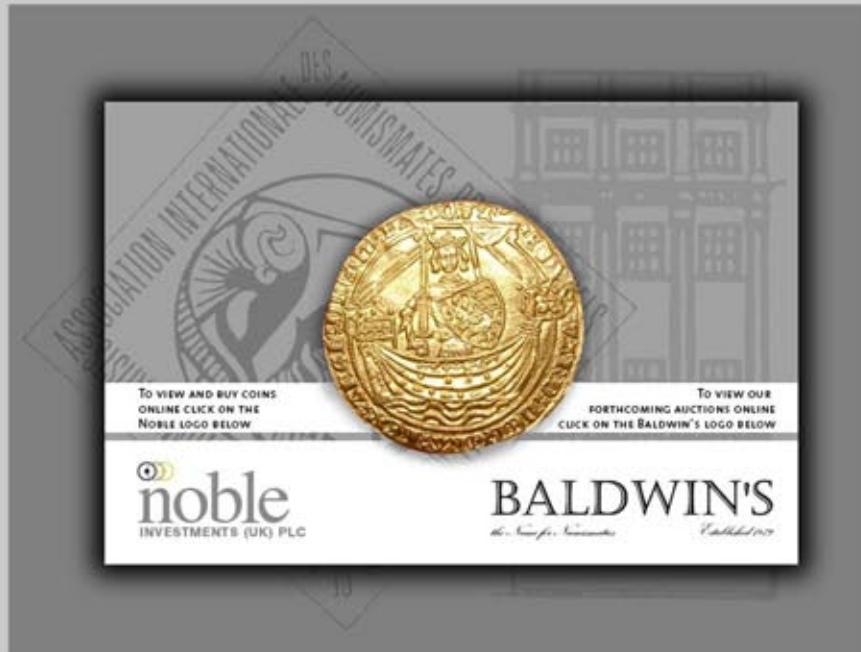
This study sets out to record and analyse the approx. 34,500 coins which remain at Baldwin's along with information about coins already disposed of in various ways. There are notes on the Irish coins, with a series of plates of the obverse dies, as well as data on the numerous Continental imitations.
