WASHINGTON, Sept. 30 (U.P.)—The Army unveiled a new 85-ton atomic gun and showed that it can roll smoothly across fields into positions to fire super-atomic weapons within 20 minutes.

It is the world's first atomic artillery piece.

The gun, which the Army called "Fat Man," is a 12-inch, 155-mm. gun, built by the Ordnance Corps at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md.

The gun has a caliber of 280 millimeters, approximately 11 inches. It is 12 feet long, including the barrel, and weighs 85 tons.

The gun is built on a trailer, and can be moved by a single tractor. It is designed to fire a 15,000-pound atomic warhead.

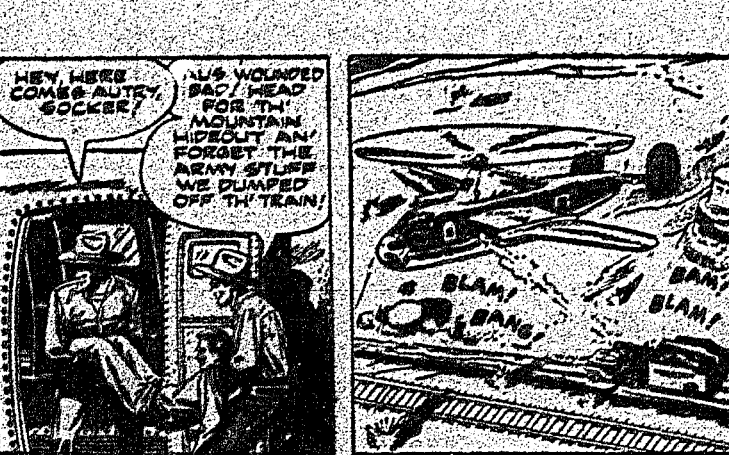

Truman's Junket Sets Precedent

By GARDNER BRIDGE

WASHINGTON, Sept. 25 (AP)—President Truman's cross-country campaign trip in behalf of the Stevenson-Sparks ticket is setting a precedent in American political history. Never before has a red-tape president covered so much territory and undertaken so many speeches at such financial cost in an effort to win the election for his own party's nominee.

Truman's special train, which left here Saturday night, will take him on a 3,000-mile two-week sweep to California and back. His schedule calls for at least 75 train trips.

There have been only three prior occasions in the last half century when it was possible for the entire president to keep his party's nominee in the campaign trail. In one of these cases, Woodrow Wilson was to sail in 1920 to do any campaigning for James M. Cox, who lost to Warren G. Harding.

In another, Calvin Coolidge remained virtually on the sidelines while the Republican ticket, headed by Charles G. Dawes, was defeated by Franklin D. Roosevelt.

The "Talk-Roosevelt" teamwork of the late volume of the "Letters of Theodore Roosevelt," edited by Elliot L. Morrison and recently published by the Harvard University Press.

"R. helped win the Republican ticket in 1920," said William Howard Taft, who was president of the party platform, and then waged a campaign of open letters in support of the Republican ticket.

Roosevelt made no speeches for the party platform, but he did, however, saying that in his judgment, "it would do him harm, rather than good."

Stevenson Lends Ike Helping Hand

Governor Gives General a Plug When He Mentions the Taft-Ike Alliance

WASHINGTON—Governor Stevenson may be realizing it, but every time he refers to the Taft-Ike alliance, he gives General Eisenhower the strongest assist of the campaign—something nobody else could do as effectively. Then everything changed. Thanks to the unstinted assist from Governor Stevenson, who tells the Taft Republicans that he thinks they really won on principle, after all, and that the Republican nominee now has "surrendered" his convictions.

LEFTIST DESERTIONS
That's good news for the Taft Republicans, every time it is music to their ears. At last they can take off their coats and go to work. For what better proof have they than Eisenhower stand solidly and firmly on good old-fashioned Americanism?

Even Senator Wayne Morse of Oregon, whose early support of General Eisenhower puzzled many regular Republicans, said he would "take a walk." Those Taft Republicans who couldn't believe Stevenson's verdict of a "surrender" to Taft could certainly be guided by the decision of the Oregon Senator to "take a stroll" and not to campaign actively.

Every time some publication of left wing "progressivity" that has been supporting Eisenhower "reverts to type" and withdraws its support from the General, it helps bring Taft men back to the fold.

So everything is rolling now and the prospects of a united Republican party working in this campaign are better than they have been in many years.

ACCENTUATES SPLIT

New Eisenhower Vote Plan Studied

Gov. Allan Shivers and other Texas Democratic Party officials considered Tuesday a new plan by which Texas Democrats could vote for Republican Dwight Eisenhower without leaving their party.

The plan was suggested Monday by Claude Gilmer of Rocksprings, chairman of the Texas Democrats for Eisenhower, who said he thought the plan legal and honorable and workable.

Briefly, the Gilmer plan would have Democrats opposing Presidential Candidate Adlai Stevenson to:

1. Scratch Stevenson's name in the Democratic column.
2. Write in Eisenhower's name in the Democratic column.

Other members of the Stevenson-Sparkman campaign committee in Texas, which Sewell heads, said they would investigate the plan's legality before commenting.

Gov. Shivers was not available for comment late Monday. He and U. S. Senate nominee Price Daniel, who are the leaders of the "Texas revolt," which was climaxed at the Amarillo State Democratic Convention, Sept. 8.

The convention certified Stevenson as the presidential nominee of the party, but by resolution asked Democrats to support and vote for Eisenhower, GOP nominee, for President.

Both Shivers and Daniel, as well as other state Democratic nominees, have been nominated by the Republicans too. Only Agriculture Commissioner John C. White, among the state office holders, has refused the GOP nomination.

Gilmer, close political friend of Shivers, asked the governor to seek an opinion from Atty. Gen. Daniel on the legality of his suggestion.

Meanwhile, there were these other developments on the Texas political scene:

1. Sen. Lyndon B. Johnson will accompany Stevenson on the Democratic presidential candidate's two-day campaign swing through Texas. In making the announcement yesterday, Speaker Sam Rayburn, head of the Stevenson-Sparkman forces in Texas, said San Antonio had been added to Stevenson's itinerary.

2. William McCraw, Dallas leader in the Stevenson campaign, said the Presidential candidate would speak at the State Fair of Texas in Dallas on the night of Oct. 17. The Democratic candidate will be in Texas two days after Eisenhower completes a two-day visit.

3. The Dallas News said in a story from its Washington bureau that GOP Vice Presidential Candidate Richard Nixon would make a return trip to Texas "sometime after the middle of October." Nixon spoke in Amarillo last Friday night but didn't get to any other Texas points.
